

- 4) See the secretary's report for more information.



#### **My Two Cents Worth**

Happy New Year to those not knowing. This is Richard, current treasurer for our SOCAL Chapter of the AMCA. I'm writing this to let you folks know our current financial status, what we're doing, and some things that may occur in the future.

First we are solvent with \$4000 in the bank. That's a decent sum to have since it takes about this much up front money to put on runs like our Borrego Springs Winter Run and the Death Valley Max Brubeck International Road Run. So that's where we are today and we will not incur any costs for this year's cancelled Borrego Springs Winter Run (a few of us are planning to be there anyways between March 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>) so it would appear in the short term to stay there.

What we're doing (here's where I ask for more money)

Number one is **Annual Dues**. Since we are not having a Borrego Springs Winter Run this year (those who attend have \$20 credited towards annual dues), I need you folks that have not already sent them in **send in your \$20** and the renewal form to me at SOCAL AMCA Dues 16101 Routt Street, Fountain Valley, CA 92708. Tim will talk about this in more details in his letter.

Being a charitable group, the current SOCAL Chapter officers have voted to donate at least \$1000 to the Borrego Springs charities to give back a little of what we have gotten from the rides here for the last 20 years.

Operating expenses are to go up for things like storage, and media costs that our officers have been paying out of their own pockets. These costs shouldn't amount to much but may be up to \$100 per month. \$1200 per year. Their time is still to be freely donated at no charge but I don't think it is right for us to allow them to pay for Chapter's expenses.

To help offset the above costs and to keep our account at its present level we are initiating two Fund Raising events. One is a donation to the **Borrego Springs Charities Fund**. All donations from this will go direct to people in need in Borrego Springs and will be funneled through an Organizer that Tim has sought out that will direct it without cost to those in need. Many of the hotel workers and the restaurant workers are having a hard time. They are the ones that have made our visits so enjoyable. If you can, send a check with Borrego Springs in the memo for any amount. All assistance is appreciated. **SOCAL AMCA Borrego 16101 Routt Street, Fountain Valley, CA 92708.** Thank you in advance.

listing of what is available on our website. I'll try to keep it as updated as possible.





After I took over this position we were notified by the State that our tax filing status was not correct. Long story short I couldn't resolve the issue and asked that we hire a profession firm to do so. So far this correction has cost us \$2000 and it's not over yet, meaning it may cost more.
